KMV introduced Credit Based Continuous evaluation grading system in all Masters programmes. All B.Vocs and M.Voc. programmes are already in CBCES system. College is also planning to convert all remaining UG programmes into credit system from the session 2023-24 as per NEP

➤ **Introduction of Interdisciplinary courses in Master Programmes.**

Institution has introduced choice based interdisciplinary courses in all Masters classes from session 2022-23. Interdisciplinary courses introduced are Effective Communication Skills, Fundamentals of Music, Human Rights and Constitutional Duties, Basics of Computer Applications, Indian Heritage: Contribution to the world.

➤ **Arranging industrial training and internships for students:**

To make students job ready, as many as 775 students participated in industrial training / internships in various industries like tourism, food industry, chemical industry, textile, hospitals and business houses to provide students hands on training and 46 industrial trips were organised About 209 students also attended Job Readiness programme organised by career counselling and placement team.

➤ **Using innovative teaching –learning methods to make teaching learning interesting:**

During 2022-23, many students centric innovative teaching -learning methods were used which include experimentation & demonstrations, virtual visits, international lecture series hands-on training, group discussions, class-room interactions & brainstorming sessions, debates, subject related quiz & extempore, case studies, projects & assignments, creative writing, role plays, poster and paper presentation, power point presentation, internships. industrial trainings, seminars & workshops, extension lectures, field visits, educational trips, book reviews, report writing etc.

➤ **Organised classes for advanced learners and remedial classes for slow learners-**

In order to cater to diversity of students and different needs of students, groups of students were made on the basis of their performance in CP-I and MST and special classes were organised for advanced learners and slow learners.

➤ **Preparation of academic calendar and adherence to it**

At the commencement of each academic session, the COE's office collaborates with the Planning and Evaluation Committee following discussions with the Deans to formulate the academic calendar, subsequently made available on the institution's website. Adherence to this calendar for all academic activities is a standard practice, barring unforeseen circumstances.

➤ Signing of MOUs with industries and academic institutions and keeping the MOUs functional—

During 2022-23, 40 MOUs have been active between the institution and various industries.

➤ To organise intra college and inter-college competitions, exhibitions.

College also organised **196 inter and intra College competitions** and exhibitions like IT GAMMAT-2022, Brain Storm and Sukriti during the year like:

An online Inter College competition GANIT MANTHAN- 2022 was organised by PG Department of Mathematics on 16.6.2022, On 4.8.22, Science departments organized SCI VESTA under DST Curie Grant to explore scientific temperament in students, on 27.10.22, PG Department of Computer Science and Applications organized an Intra College IT GAMMAT-2022 and many more.

➤ **To take feedback on curriculum and on teachers.**

As a practice, feedback of students, teachers and employers was taken on curriculum and feedback on teachers was also taken.

II) Global Endeavours:

- PG Department of Physics organised international workshop on glass preparation for the celebrations of Glass year 2023. Dr. Ashutosh Goel, Associate Professor in Department of Materials Science and Engineering, Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey was the resource person for the workshop.
- PG Department of Chemistry organised an online lecture under International series (Chemistry Chapter) on Supramolecular Chemistry and its Intriguing Potential Applications. Dr. Subhamay Pramanik, Department of Chemistry, Kansas University, USA was the resource person for the lecture.
- PG Department of Mathematics, organised an International Workshop on Wonders of Vedic Mathematics. Mr. James Glover, Chairman, Co-founder and Academic Director, International Institute for the Advancement of Vedic Mathematics, United Kingdom was the resource person for the workshop.
- A five-day Faculty Development Program on Building Writing Skills was organised by the PG Department of English which was attended by more than 150 participants from various educational institutions across the country. Dr. Naima Han, Senior Consultant, Leeds Beckett University, UK participated as a resource person in this program.
- An International Webinar was organised on the topic “Drug prevention and Role of a psychologist”. The eminent resource person for the webinar was Dr. Katalin Felvinczi , Professor and Dean Commissioner, Faculty of Education and Psychology, Eotvos Lorand University, Budapest, Hungary

III) Inculcation of scientific temperament amongst students:

- **Organised scientific quiz, competitions, experimental workshops and other scientific activities to popularise science.**

Science departments have organised training workshops, educational trips to NPL, IMT, PIMS, CSIR, National Institute of Bioenergy, Central Potato Research Station, National Agri-Biotechnology Institute (NABI), Mohali, Ranjit Sagar Dam etc. quiz competitions on different topics and celebrated national and international days like International Mathematics Day to popularise science.

IV) Research, Extension and Consultancy:

➤ **Organised Research mentoring committee meetings to check progress of already sanctioned projects:** The research mentoring committee conducted meetings to check progress of ongoing seed money projects. Presentations were made by the Principal Investigators of seed money projects. The external experts' comments about the progress of the projects were recorded in minutes of these meetings. Some projects were also approved for submission.

➤ **Invited proposals for fresh sanction of projects under seed money:** To promote research among its faculty and students, seed money of Rs.6,60,000 was sanctioned out of college funds to the faculty and students for six seed money projects for the session 2022-23. Two teachers were selected for research awards of Rs. 10000 each on the basis of quality of research. In senior category award was given to Dr. Rashmi Sharma from Physics Department and in junior category it was presented to Dr. Natasha from Maths department.

➤ **Organised research forum.**

➤ **Sanction of Research Projects from external Agencies:**

- Dr. Rashmi Sharma, Associate Professor, PG Department of Commerce and Business Administration has been awarded Major Research Project by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) on the topic “Dynamics of Innovation Culture Among Women Entrepreneurs in Low Tech Service Industry in Punjab” with a research grant of Rs. 7,28,000.
- Dr Neetu Verma and Dr. Gopi Sharma PG Department of Physics have been awarded a research grant worth Rs. 25.5 Lakh from the Board of Research in Nuclear Science (BRNS) for conducting research on the radiation shielding windows based on oxide glasses for three years.
- Dr. Monica Sharma, Associate Professor, Department of History has been awarded with Minor Research Project by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) on the topic “Skilling the Rural Women of Punjab: A Study on the Effectiveness of Vocational Training Programmes in Villages” with a research grant of Rs. 3,00,000.

➤ **Undertaking various activities under Institution Innovation Cell (IIC) :**

KMV IIC organises various self-driven activities round the year, which includes inviting experts having entrepreneurial experience of years, organising business idea competitions to business model canvas developments, workshops on design thinking and IPR. Not only this, the students here get platform to sell their products through city level exhibitions as well as during various events organised at college for the budding entrepreneurs. The activities also include the visit to various centres of excellence by organising educational trips to National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi and to centres like CSIO dedicated to research, design and development of scientific instruments; NIPGR dedicated to plant-based research; National Institute of Bioenergy; Central Potato Research Station, Jalandhar, ITC, Kapurthala, etc.

KMV has been recognised as one of the best performing Institutions Innovation Council Institutions by Ministry of Education's Innovation cell (MIC) and has been selected by Ministry of Education's Innovation Council to highlight the achievements of its Innovation Council at the Regional Meet of MoE's innovation cell.

➤ **Faculty has filed one international patent and twenty-five IPRs.**

➤ During 2022-23, faculty has published 66 papers in UGC CARE list of Journals and is guiding 11 Ph.Ds.

V) Governance and Leadership:

• Organising Faculty Development Programmes:

- A five-day Faculty Development Program on Building Writing Skills was organised by the PG Department of English which was attended by more than 150 participants from various educational institutions across the country. Dr. Naima Han, Senior Consultant, Leeds Beckett University, UK participated as a resource person in this program.
- A one day National seminar was organised on 10.9.22 on “Quality Enhancement in Higher Education and Revised Accreditation Framework”. This seminar was in hybrid mode and was attended by around 50 delegates from Punjab and other states like Maharashtra, Kerala, Haryana and other states Key Note address was delivered by Dr. B. S. Ponnudiraj, who is currently the Academic Adviser with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Other resource persons were Dr. Smita Raosaheb Deshmukh, Principal, Matoshri Vimlabai Deshmukh Mahavidyalaya, Maharashtra, Dr. S.S Chahal, Former Vice Chancellor, Maharana Partap University of Agriculture & Technology, Udaipur and Dr. Renu Bhardwaj, Professor, Department of Botanical and Environmental Sciences, GNDU, Amritsar.
- IQAC organised a workshop on “NAAC Methodology” on 4.6.22. The resource person for the workshop was Dr. B. S. Ponnudiraj, who is currently the Academic Adviser with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Delegates from all over Punjab & J & K etc. participated in this workshop.

➤ Quality Initiatives:

- Submitted AQAR of 21-22 on 25.02.23.
- KMV has been bestowed with the Times Achievers Award 2022 for Excellence in Progressive Education by Times of India Group.
- KMV has been ranked among top colleges of India for fourth time in a row in the prestigious India Today Rankings (2022). It has being ranked 5th in Fashion Design in India in Lowest Fees category, 9th in Best Value for Money in Fashion Design in India, 3rd in Mass Communication in Punjab, 2nd in Commerce in Punjab, 3rd in BBA in Punjab & 2nd in BCA in Punjab in India Today Survey of Best Colleges.
- KMV has been ranked no. 1 in BBA & BCA & has also bagged No. 1 Ranking in Arts & Commerce stream among all the Autonomous colleges of Punjab. KMV has been ranked 23rd in BCA, 36th in BBA, 72nd in Arts & 70th in Commerce in India.
- KMV has been bestowed with the 10 years of extension to its autonomous status by University Grants Commission, New Delhi.
- KMV organized Industry-Academia Meet 2023, in which 33 Industry Experts from various fields graced the occasion.
- KMV's has been awarded 9 Vocational Training Courses by Government of India and received a grant of 31 lacs under Skill Hub Initiative of Government of India.
- Teachers have attended 16 short term courses, 175 faculty development programmes, 03 induction programmes, 07 refresher courses, 28 Webinars and workshops during the year.

- Young trainees at KMV had an interface with prominent professionals from various fields in order to hone their professional skills. About 33 industry experts related to different industries participated in the Industry Academia meet held on 3.3.2023
- College has applied for NIRF Ranking, India Today Ranking and Times group of India and outlook magazine rankings during 2022-23. College has received top rankings for many programmes like BBA, BCA, FD etc in Punjab.

VI) To Strengthen Student Support Activities:

➤ To strengthen mentoring and other student support services and to take feed back of students on various aspects

Mentoring programme is carried out regularly in which about 14 students are allotted to each mentor in each mentor-mentee group, who keeps in touch with students and keep track of their academic and mental wellbeing. Many student support activities and resources are active in full swing like Orientation Programme for new comers, Reader's club, Counselling and Career Counselling cell, Cell against Sexual harassment, Grievance addressal cell, Book Bank etc.

Feedback from students is taken on teachers, curriculum and Institution and analysed.

In an another initiative, Parent Teacher Meet for the students of all streams of the college was organized on 28.4.23. It was an interactive exercise in which the parents and guardians joined with great zeal as their queries about their wards' progress were answered by the teachers and their performance in the exams was also discussed in detail.

➤ To strengthen the linkages and collaborations with industry for training and placements and to organise placement drives and career orientation programmes

MOUs are signed with 40 industries/ Institutions and 194 collaborative activities were performed like training, internships and placements. More than 100 students have been placed in different sectors.

College has a very strong Career Counselling and placement cell. Career counselling programmes have been organised for students by internal and external experts. Students have been regularly informed and guided about job openings by placement team members.

Following major career counselling activities were carried out during the session:

- KMV organized a Career Counseling Workshop on Career as a Company Secretary in collaboration with Institute of Company Secretaries of India on 24-09-2022.
- On 27.9.22, the Centre for Competitive Exam organised a workshop on 'How to Prepare for Civil Services Exams.' Dr. Kuldip Singh, Former Professor, Department of Political Science, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and Director, Centre for Competitive Exams was the resource person for this workshop. Dr. Kuldip Singh addressing the students highlighted the relevance of civil services in the present context.
- On 17.10.22, KMV organised Mohiniyattam Recital program in collaboration with SPIC MACAY (Society for the Promotion of Indian Classical Music And Culture Amongst Youth). During the program, Guru Dr. Rekha Raju, a prolific Mohiniyattam dancer graced the occasion.

Professor and a Specialist in International Relations, Management Studies was invited by the KMV NCC unit to throw light on ‘Future Career Aspects in Indian Defense Services’.
- On 15.5.23, KMV organised a session on Expectations and Interview Process for the students of Fourth and Sixth Semesters of Computer Science and Mathematics. The session was conducted by Mr Mukesh Kumar, Principal Group Software Engineering Manager at Microsoft India (R &D) Private Limited to make the students understand about the interview process in big product based and service-based companies followed by interview procedures, their work culture and what the company experts expect from the freshers.

➤ **To enhance the concessions for needy and deserving students**

During 2022-23, College has disbursed an amount of 43,74,172- as scholarships and concessions for 1189 needy and deserving students.

During 22-23 also KMV took a colossal step for their welfare by announcing full free ship for 5% deserving students in each program. The college provided financial support and incentives to students with outstanding performance in academics, co-curricular activities & sports and to students with physical disabilities, besides helping the needy and economically weak students.

- The college awards full freeship to students scoring 95% marks & above and students achieving top position in the university in any stream.
- The college offers an amount of Rs. 8000 as scholarship to students scoring 90 to 94.9 percent marks, Rs 5000 to students obtaining 86 to 89.9 percent marks and Rs 3000 to students securing 80 to 85.9 percent marks.
- The students securing 1st position in the class receives Rs. 4000 as scholarship, Rs. 2000 is given to students securing 2nd position in the class.
- All college players get full freeship, free boarding & free lodging facility.

- To promote women education, KMV has announced a concession of Rs. 2500 annually to single girl child & Rs. 2500 Sister concession.
- A concession of Rs. 10000 is reserved for parentless students and a concession of Rs. 5000 is given to Single mother child & a concession of Rs. 10000 is provided to the physically challenged students.
- Any student whose father has expired will also get a concession of Rs. 5000.
- College also provides full freeship for the ward of Martyrs and a concession of Rs. 5000 for the wards of Armed Personnel.
- In order to promote Sanskrit language, College also provides a concession of Rs. 3500 annually to the students opting for Sanskrit.
- In addition to these scholarships, the outstanding achievers in academics, Extra Curricular Activities and other areas receive scholarships/ cash awards.
- On 7.2.23, KMV's Book Bank distributed free of cost books to almost 500 students

➤ **To enhance student participation in day to day functioning of the institution**

Students are encouraged to organise department and college activities, to perform proctorial duties in campus and hostel, maintain wall magazines, student boards, run clubs and societies, festival celebrations, Freshers and Farewell Functions, maintaining book bank and help desk, mentoring new students, act as discipline squad & Water Warriors, make college promotion videos, attend open house with principal to participate in decision making etc.
