

Report On Teachers' Feedback on Curriculum

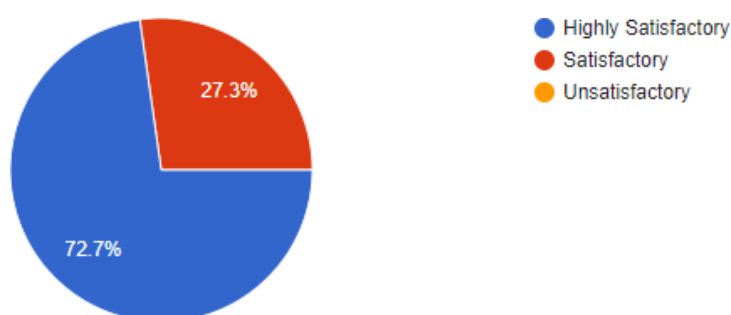

Our college teachers with the valuable suggestions from experts have revised and upgraded the syllabi with 21st century global skills. Internship, Industrial Training and other practical trainings have been incorporated in the syllabi depending upon the course curriculum.

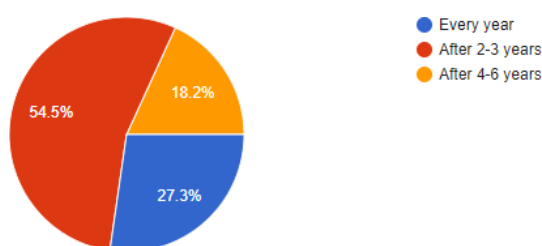
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The major findings are as follows :

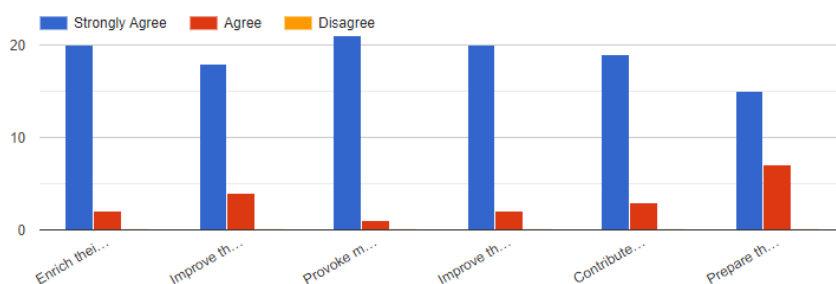
- Seventy two percent teachers are highly satisfied with the depth of course content and 27 percent teachers are satisfied with it.



- Nearly fifty five percent teachers feel that syllabi should be revised after a gap of 2-3 years and eighteen percent feel that it should be revised after a gap of 4-6 years and twenty seven percent feel that it should be revised every year.



- **Ninety one percent teachers are strongly agreed that curriculum helps in enriching learning of students .**
- **Sixty seven percent are strongly agreed with the contribution of curriculum towards improving motivation among students.**
- **Ninety five percent are strongly agreed with curriculum in provoking meaningful discussions among students.**
- **Ninety one percent teachers are strongly agreed with the contribution of curriculum towards improving career prospects**
- **Eighty six percent teachers are strongly agreed that curriculum contributes towards personality development**
- **Sixty eight percent teachers are strongly agreed that curriculum prepares students as more aware and responsible citizens .**
