Instructions for the Practical Examiner:

The practical examiner will test and assess the following:

1. Building-up the Basic Concepts

This refers to the range, accurate and appropriate use of the test takers' grammatical resources. The key indicators of grammatical range are the accuracy of the spoken sentences, the appropriate use of parts of speech, tenses, modals voice, narration and subject-verb agreement. The examiner can also ask questions based on picture composition.

2. Conversational Skills

This refers to the ability to talk with normal levels of continuity, rate and effort. The examiner can ask the students to introduce themselves, and can ask questions based on situations, and the students can also be asked for role play.

3. GDPI (Group Discussion and Personal Interview)

This criterion refers to the ability to produce comprehensible sentences with correct pronunciation. The students can be asked to participate in group discussion. The examiner can also give a topic and ask the students to deliver an extempore speech.

Instructions for the Practical Examiner

Section I: Building – up the Basic Concepts

The examiner will test the student's ability to use the given units accurately, use of proverbs, idioms, one word substitution, synonyms and antonyms. The examiner will assess the student's basic understanding of the concepts of syllable, accent and weak forms without going into the theoretical issues.

2. Speaking/Conversation Skills

The examiner will take stock of the student's ability to speak in English as per the given topics. Examiner can ask students to narrate a story in any of the tenses, to describe an interaction with Doctor, Stranger, Teacher, Neighbour or Police Officer. Students can also be asked to think and describe an imaginary character/situation.

3. GDPI (Group Discussion and Personal Interview)

This criterion refers to the student's ability to produce comprehensible sentences with accuracy. The students can be asked to participate in a cue-card speaking and group discussion. The examiner can also ask them to make a presentation on some current topic and assess their interview skills through a mock interview.
