

The KMV Legacy


Kanya Maha Vidyalaya, a Heritage College with Potential for Excellence and reaccredited 'A' by NAAC-UGC, is the land sanctified by the "Sadma" of a Karmyogi, Lala Dev Raj Ji. A small sapling in 1886, grown into a gigantic tree, continues to provide calm repose of enlightenment to the generation of women. The crusader for women education Lala Dev Raj Ji, imbued with the spirit of Arya Samaj and inspired by the teachings of Swami Dayanand, came to the forefront with a noble mission to educate women by dispelling their darkness. Only the magic lamp of education could uplift them from the quagmire of Orthodox retrogressive society indifferent to deplorable conditions of women. Undeterred and undaunted by the financial constraints and the virtual rebukes of a conservative society, hostile to the very notion of an educated woman, Lala Ji blazed a trail and established a Bal Shiksha Vidyalaya with just six students and laid the foundation of this historic institution.

Under the committed stewardship of Lala Dev Raj Ji and his illustrious successors, Rai Bahadur Badri Dass, Smt. Savitri Devi, Smt. Shanno Devi, the Vidyalaya had a meteoric rise as emerged as a nerve centre of resurgent nationalism where pride in being an Indian and fierce patriotism were inculcated in the young students. The Vidyalaya, redolent with the soil "Haldi Ghati", has the proud distinction of having been an active participant rather than a mute spectator to the movement for "Puran Swaraj". Sushila didi who assisted the great martyr S. Bhagat Singh to escape the chasing British was a snatika of this Vidyalaya. At a time when singing of "Vande Mataram" invited flogging and hoisting of the national flag was deemed a crime against the mighty British empire, the students of Kanya Maha Vidyalaya sang "Vande Mataram" with full-throated nationalistic fervour, hoisted the national flag, spelt shiksha and wore khadi. In keeping with the same Gandhian spirit, Khadi uniform is still worn on Mondays. With the demise of Lala Dev Raj Ji, Acharya Lajjavati took over the reins of the institution and nourished the Vidyalaya with an unwavering commitment and matchless resolve. Thanks to her vision and foresight, the Vidyalaya developed into a premier institution of women education. Seth Satya Pal Ji, an enterprising personality, a disciplinarian was a beacon light who steered the Vidyalaya to glory and fame. After him Sh. Virendra Ji, an epitome

of altruism and embodiment of patriotic zeal, took up the task of guiding the destiny of the Vidyalaya. Under him, the Vidyalaya scaled new heights, touched new horizons of progress, opened new vistas for students, carved a niche for itself in the annals of time and emerged as a fine synthesis of tradition and modernity.

The footprints of our founders and inspirers will always remain on the sands of time. At present the reins of this institution are in the hands of a progressive and supportive management led by the President, S. Chander Mohan. The Principal, Prof. Atima Sharma Dwivedi, with her global vision, commitment to innovation, dynamic leadership and tireless work ethics is steering the college to a spot of recognition on the world education map. 

KMV - A Future Ready Institution



PROSPECTUS

Every student seeking admission to the college must obtain the college prospectus. It contains an admission form, which must be duly filled in legibly by the student. As admission is made strictly on merit, the form must be presented as soon as the admission starts.

CERTIFICATES REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- Original certificate of the last University/Board examination passed and an attested photograph
- Character certificate duly attested by the Head of the Institution last attended
- Certificates of Merit for meritorious performance in games and co-curricular activities from the Head of the Institution last attended
- A copy of Aadhaar card

SEATS

Since the number of seats allotted to each class is restricted, admission will be closed as soon as the required number is completed. Late admission will be permitted only if seats are available. Reservation of Seats as per GNDU/Punjab Govt. Rules.

MERIT

Admission to various classes shall be done strictly on merit and first-come first-served basis.

FOR SPECIAL ATTENTION OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. Parents / guardians are requested to go through the college prospectus / hostel handbook thoroughly and comply with the instructions given therein.
2. Seats are limited in the hostel. Accommodation will be given on 'first-come-first-served' basis. However, merit students will be given preference.
3. For the benefit of students seeking accommodation in the hostel, a separate prospectus with admission form is available and can be had on payment from the office.
4. **A student may change her course/programme within one month from the start of Semester I.**
5. Continuous absence of the ward from college / hostel without genuine reason will be seriously dealt with. A written application for leave should reach the Principal from the parent of the ward.
6. Students can leave the college only after their classes are over or after the sixth period whichever is later. For no reason will they be allowed to leave the college before the specified time.
7. It is compulsory for every student to attend 75% of the lectures delivered and to appear for the house examinations, to be eligible to sit in the final examinations.
8. General Eligibility

FAILED AND COMPARTMENT CANDIDATES

(a) Students who have been placed under compartment in 10+2 examination are eligible for admission provisionally, subject to their clearing the compartment by December of the same year, failing which their provisional admission will stand cancelled automatically and no claim of refund will be entertained.

(This condition is subject to the order/instruction issued by the university from time to time.)

(b) Failed and compartment candidates from other colleges will not be admitted.

STUDENTS MIGRATING FROM PUNJAB/ PUNJABI UNIVERSITY

Students migrating from Punjab/ Punjabi University will be required to produce the following documents at the time of admission :

- (i) Original Certificate and detailed marks card of the lower examination passed by them.
- (ii) Migration certificate, in original, issued by the University from which they are migrating.
- (iii) Students migrating from Punjab/ Punjabi University will not be required to produce eligibility certificate. They will, however, be required to produce migration certificate and pay university migration fee.

STUDENTS MIGRATING FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES / BOARDS

All students migrating from other Universities/ Boards (except Punjab University/Punjabi University/PSEB) must obtain eligibility certificate from GNDU., Amritsar at the time of admission to this college. For this purpose, they should apply before hand to the University on prescribed application/eligibility form along with the following documents:

- (i) Detailed Marks Certificate, in original, of the lower examination from the University /Board
- (ii) Migration Certificate, in original, issued by the University/Board
- (iii) 10th DMC (Only for NIOS Board, New Delhi)

CAUTION :

In case a student is unable to produce eligibility certificate at the time of admission, she may take provisional admission at her own risk and responsibility. Decision of the University, in such cases, will be final and the candidate will have no claim whatsoever against the College/University if her provisional admission is cancelled by the University. (Students admitted provisionally should submit the required documents.)

4. STUDENTS OPTING FOR PUNJAB HISTORY AND CULTURE / BASIC PUNJABI SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY AND SUBMIT AN AFFIDAVIT (SPECIMEN GIVEN) TO THE PRINCIPAL AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

Candidates relating to any of the following categories shall be allowed to select Punjab History and Culture or Basic Punjabi in place of Punjabi Compulsory at Under-Graduate level. Such candidates shall submit in 1st Semester/year only an affidavit (specimen enclosed) of the value of Rs. 3/- attested by Local Executive Magistrate. In case the candidates are non-resident of Punjab State, they shall submit domicile certificate of the state concerned from the competent authority. The Principal of the college/ Head of the Department shall keep the affidavit / domicile certificate in record and certify the concerned category at the time of submitting Registration Returns to the University.

A candidate is an employee or employee's son/ daughter serving in the Government / Non-Government/ Central Government/ Security Forces who has stayed outside Punjab/ Chandigarh (U.T.) for at least 10 years immediately before the admission and has not studied Punjabi up to Matric Level.

OR

A Candidate who has passed plus two examinations with Punjab History and Culture subjects in Place of Punjabi Compulsory from Punjab School Education Board, Mohali.

OR

A Candidate who has passed Matriculation examination from outside Punjab State/ Chandigarh (U.T.) without Punjabi Subject.

OR

A Candidate who is neither a Domicile of Punjab State nor her mother Tongue is Punjabi and has not studied Punjabi Subject up to Matric / Hr. Sec. Part I/II, 10+2/ Pre University Level.

OR

A Candidate who is an N.R.I. or a Foreigner.

OR

The Candidates who have migrated to this University before or passing B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com. part I examination and have not studied Punjabi Compulsory subject in the previous University may also select Punjab History and Culture in place of Punjabi Compulsory.

5. FOREIGN STUDENTS

- (i) Foreign students must produce the certificates of eligibility from GNDU, Amritsar and equivalency certificate from Association of Indian Universities, 16-Kotla Marg, New Delhi at the time of admission, in the absence of which their applications of admission will not be considered.
- (ii) A foreign student must possess 'Student Visa' before admission. Students coming on 'Tourist Visa' will not be admitted unless they produce approval of Govt. of India.

5. EXAMINATION NOT RECOGNISED

Students who have passed their lower examination from any private University only regular students within the campus of such university shall be eligible to take admission in any course as per university eligibility rules. Off campus students from such type of universities will not be eligible. Examination conducted by the Central Board of Higher Education, Tilak Nagar, Delhi and any other examination not recognized as equivalent to the corresponding examination of GNDU. Students who have passed such examinations are not to be given admission even provisionally. Students having passed B.Sc. Fashion Designing from Annamalai University under distance education are not eligible to take admission in the next class as per decision of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court vide case CWP No. 7139 of 2009.

7. LATE DECLARATION OF RESULT

- (i) Candidates whose results are to be announced late are allowed to join the next higher class provisionally but they should submit an affidavit duly attested by Ist Class Magistrate or self declaration duly signed by Parents, provided they pass or satisfy the percentage condition. Otherwise their admission will stand cancelled and they will have no claim against the college.
- (ii) A student whose result is published late by GNDU or another recognized University/Board can be admitted without late fee within twelve working days (excluding two transit days) from the date of declaration of result by University/Board.

8. DEFICIENT SUBJECTS

Candidates who have passed their lower examination from other Board/University recognized by GNDU without Punjabi (Compulsory) and/or one elective subject, may be allowed to study in the next class provisionally subject to clearing the deficient subjects of B.A./B.Sc. I/II Sem and III/IV sem. examinations, as the case may be in two admissible chances. In case, she fails to qualify the deficient subject/s her provisional admission in B.A./ B.Sc. Sem. III & Sem. V class shall stand automatically cancelled and she shall have no claim whatsoever against the college or the university where she is admitted to.

CAUTION :

- (a) Please note that regarding the eligibility for admission to a particular class, the decision of GNDU is final. Therefore, students who have passed their lower examinations from Universities or Boards other than Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab University, Chandigarh, Punjabi University, Patiala and Punjab School Education Board, S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali are advised to bring their eligibility certificates from GNDU, Amritsar at the time of admission. In case a student is unable to produce eligibility certificates at the time of her admission, she may take provisional admission at her own risk and responsibility. At any later stage, if her provisional admission is cancelled by the University, the college will not be responsible for any loss, whatsoever, to the candidate and no claim of refund will be entertained.
- (b) Courses and eligibility rules given here are subject to amendment/additions approved by the competent authority.



Advantages of Continuous Evaluation System (CES) and Credit Based Continuous Evaluation Grading System (CBCEGS) under Autonomy by KMV

1. Continuous Assessment will be provided to all the students enrolled for all programmes on the following basis :
 - a. 80% Weightage to End Semester Examination (ESE)
 - b. 20% Weightage to Continuous Assessment (CA) including Mid Semester Test (MST) (10%) + Class Performance (CP) (5%) + Attendance (A) (5%)
2. Retests will be conducted with special permission from the Principal only for those students who have missed the MST/ ESE due to
 - a. Participation in college-sponsored activities such as NCC, NSS, Sports, Extra Curricular Activities (ECA). The students must have participated at District, State/Inter-university, National or International level.
 - b. Medical reason (due to accident/long-term illness/hospitalisation) or any other extraordinary circumstances.
 - c. Mis-happening in her first blood relation (Mother / Father / Sister / Brother / Daughter / Son) and In-Laws (Husband / Mother-in-Law / Father-in-Law).

NOTE : Retests of MST will be conducted in the month of October and April in odd and even semesters respectively and that of ESE will be conducted within 15 days after the last day of ESE for those students who have missed ESE due to reasons b. and c. However for the students who have missed ESE due to reason a., these tests will be conducted as per their availability.

3. In case, a student wants to improve her score in one or more courses/papers in any of the semesters/years after completing the programme so as to obtain a minimum of 60% marks in aggregate to get the first division (CES) or 6.00 CGPA (CBCEGS) within a maximum stipulated period to complete the programme (5 years for 3 years UG degree programme/6 years for 4 years UG degree programme, 4 years for 2 years PG degree programme). The maximum stipulated period for one year Diploma/PG Diploma Programme is 2 years under CES system and 3 years under CBCEGS system.
4. In case, a student wants to improve her score in one or more courses/papers in any of the semesters/years after completing the PG degree programme so as to obtain a minimum of 55% marks in aggregate (CES) or 5.50 CGPA (CBCEGS) within a stipulated period to complete the degree (4 Years for PG degree programme).
5. For the Programmes under CBCEGS, the grades will be provided on a 10 point scale.

Passing Marks Conditions

- Students have to clear the End Semester Examination of each course individually in all programmes under both systems i.e. CES as well as CBCEGS.
- A student has to get minimum passing marks in aggregate of CA & End Semester Examination in each course (Theory, Practical, Seminar, Viva, Project etc.) failing which the student will get a reappear in a course even if she has passed the ESE of the concerned course.
- **Under CES**, a student enrolled for UG Degree programme / Diploma has to get a 35% marks in each course individually (separately for theory and practical) and minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate at the end of final semester. If the student obtains less than 40% marks in aggregate at the end of final semester/year but is passing in all individual courses, the result of such student shall be declared Failed, but in this case, a chance will be given to improve her score in one or more courses in any of the semester/ year so as to obtain a minimum of 40% in the aggregate within a maximum stipulated period. A student registered for PG Degree Programmes has to get 40% marks in each course individually (separately for theory and practical) and also in aggregate.
- The minimum pass marks (in case of B.A. with additional courses as Honours opted in Semester-III) shall be 35% in each course and 45% in the aggregate (combined) result of Semesters III, IV, V and VI examinations of the Pass courses as well as Honours courses of the concerned subject.
- The minimum marks required to qualify for Honours in the B.Com Programme (in case of honours opted in semester-III) shall be
 - 50% marks in the aggregate of B. Com. Semester-I to VI examinations
 - 50% marks in each course separately in the ESE of the Honours courses
- **Under CBCEGS**, a student enrolled for B.Voc., M.Voc., UG Diploma, PG Diploma and 1st semester of PG Degree Programme during the session 2022-2023 has to get atleast 'P' grade (Equivalent to 40% Marks) in aggregate of CA and End Semester Examination (ESE) in each course (Theory, Practical, Seminar, Viva, Project etc.) ,failing which the student will get 'F' grade in a course, even if she has passed the ESE of the concerned course. In such cases, student has to reappear in ESE of the concerned course to get 'P' grade as per the Examination and Evaluation policy of the college.
- The minimum passing marks for Certificate Courses are 45%.

Carry-on System under Continuous Evaluation System (CES)

1. There will be no condition for promoting a student from 1st semester to 2nd semester.
(For all UG Degree Programmes and UG Diploma)

In case a student fails to pass all the courses within a period of one year (two semesters), she will be given one year (two semesters) more to pass, failing which she will have to start the whole programme afresh from the first semester. However, such a student will not be required to qualify the entrance test again, if any. **(for UG Diploma)**

The student will be promoted to the 3rd semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses of the first two semesters. But, there will be no condition for promoting a student from 3rd semester to 4th semester. **(for all UG and PG Degree Programmes)**

In case a student fails to pass all the courses within a period of two consecutive years (four semesters), she will be given two consecutive years (four semesters) more to pass, failing which she will have to start the whole programme afresh from the first semester. However, such a student will not be required to qualify the entrance test again, if any. **(for all PG Degree Programmes)**

The student will be promoted to the 5th semester only if she has passed at least 50% of the courses of the first four semesters. **(for all UG Degree Programmes)**

There will be no condition for promoting a student from 5th semester to the 6th semester. In case a student fails to pass after a period of three consecutive years (six semesters), the student will be given a period of two consecutive years (four semesters) more to pass, failing which she will have to start the whole programme afresh from the first semester. However, such a student will not be required to qualify the entrance test again, if any. **(for Three year UG Degree Programmes)**

A student will be promoted to 7th semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses of the first six semesters. **(for Four year UG Degree Programmes)**

There will be no condition for promoting a student from 7th semester to 8th semester. In case a student fails to pass after a period of four consecutive years (Eight semesters) the student will be given a period of two consecutive years (Four Semesters) more to pass failing which she will have to start the course afresh from the first semester. However, such a student will not be required to qualify the entrance test again, if any. **(for Four year UG Degree Programmes)**

Carry-on System under Credit Based Continuous Evaluation Grading System (CBCEGS)

A Student shall be required to maintain a minimum of 4.00 CGPA at the end of the final semester of her degree programme. If her CGPA falls below 4 at the end of the final semester, the student will be declared as having failed in that particular year and will have to seek re-admission in the odd semester of that particular year e.g. the candidate having failed in 4th semester of PG Programme (final) will have to seek re-admission in the 3rd semester and 6th semester of UG Programme (final) will have to

seek re-admission in 5th semester and so on. In that case such candidate will appear in End Semester Examination with existing syllabus. The marks of CA will be recalculated based on her performance during the current session.

- o A student will be required to clear at least 50% of the total theory courses (excluding Drug Abuse, Environmental Studies, Audit Course introduced by the College, Interdisciplinary Compulsory Audit Courses & Practical Courses) of all the previous semesters taken together at the end of the even semester of each academic session for promotion to the next higher semester e.g. if there are ten theory courses she will have to clear five courses, if there are eleven theory courses, then she will have to clear six courses. However, she will be required to clear the remaining courses within the duration of the maximum period specified to complete the programme. For such candidates, repeat in End Semester Examination for an odd semester shall be conducted along with the next odd semester and even semester along with the next even semester. They should register for these (repeat) courses in the beginning of that semester but need not to attend the classes again. However, they may consult the concerned teacher for guidance.
- o It will be compulsory for the students to appear in each semester end examination to take the benefit of promotion as mentioned above. In case of absence in all the courses of the end semester examination / she has not taken admission, she will not be promoted to the next higher semester, even if she has qualified 50% of the theory courses of all the preceding semesters taken together at the end of even semester. The result of such candidate will be declared absent / gap instead of reappear. For taking the benefit of promotion to the next higher semester she will have to seek readmission in that semester during the next session.
- o If a student fails in more than 50% of the theory courses at the end of the even semester of each academic session during all the preceding semesters taken together, she will be declared as having failed in that particular year and will have to seek readmission in the odd semester of that particular year of the degree.

NOTE: Reappear Examination for an odd semester will be conducted along with the next odd semester and even semester along with the next even semester in all the programmes i.e. UG and PG degree programmes, UG and PG Diploma. (under both systems i.e. CES and CBCEGS).

Examination Schedule

1. During an academic session, MST will be conducted in September for Odd Semester and in March for Even Semester. (Schedule of dates may vary if contingencies so demand).
2. CP-I and CP-II will be conducted in the month of August and October in odd semesters, whereas for even semesters, these will be conducted in the month of February and April, respectively.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The Indian Army is broadening its horizons and inducting women with open mind and heart into its various divisions. NCC is an excellent way to get into Armed forces. KMV NCC sub-unit was the first to get attached to 2PB(G) BN NCC Jalandhar. The unit has strength of 105 active girl cadets who have been performing excellently at national level by bringing laurels to the college.

The unit proactively participates in all the NCC activities organized by the group on the guidelines from the Directorate and the PMO. Cadet volunteers are engaged in institutional training in subjects like drill, Map Reading, First Aid, Health and Hygiene to name a few. They are recently during the pandemic; cadets were trained to fight Covid-19 on the Diksha portal launched by the Government. They spread the message of relevance of social distancing and hand sanitization. Food distribution, distribution of masks and gloves was also done. Swachta Abhiyan, Seminars on Plastic Pollution Menace and environment friendly activities like tree plantation, plogging, statue cleaning, were also undertaken.

This is a free of cost training for which a student pays only nominal enrolment fees at the very outset of a training year. Besides this, the following benefits are given to the students after they pass the NCC 'C' certificate exam.

- NCC cadets with 'A' or 'B' grade in NCC 'C' certificate can directly appear for SSB interview without appearing in the UPSC EXAM.
- The Defense sector has seats reserved for NCC cadets in IMA.
- In SSC, there is NCC special entry scheme for both men and women.
- Out of two candidates to qualify with the same marks while joining IPS, preference is given to NCC 'C' certificate holder.
- For recruitment in Paramilitary Forces i.e. BSE, CISE, CRPE, SSB etc., a bonus of 10-15 marks is given to a cadet.
- Can be recruited as girl cadet instructor or Adm. officer
- Bonus marks for recruitment in some Govt. jobs
- State wise bonus marks at the time of admission to Higher Education Institutions

College Rules

IDENTITY CARD

Each student is issued an identity card at the commencement of the session. The students are required to be in possession of their identity cards while in college. If a student is found without it in the college, she will be fined. If a student loses this card, she must inform the office immediately and get another card made. The students must read the rules mentioned in the identity card and adhere to them.

MONDAY ASSEMBLY

Monday morning assembly is a regular and important feature of the college. On Mondays, the national flag is hoisted and national songs are sung. It is compulsory for all students to come in white Khadi uniform. Students coming late and students not in proper uniform will be fined.

ATTENDANCE

The Principal may drop a student, who is habitually irregular in attendance and is negligent in studies, from the rolls of the college at any time during the term. If a student absents herself from the college for ten or more days continuously without applying for leave, her name may be struck off the college rolls. She may be re-admitted on payment of re-admission fee along with absence fine for all the days of her absence. If the name of the student is struck off from the college, her lectures shall not be counted till she is re-admitted.

CONDONING OF LECTURES

Students should be regular in attending classes. All the students must have a minimum of 75% attendance to appear in End Semester Examination. In case of sickness or any other convincing reason, lectures may be condoned by the Principal as per policy to enable the students to appear in End Semester Examination.

LEAVE RULES

- (i) A student should apply for leave when it is absolutely necessary. She should secure it personally before it is availed of except in case of illness, when leave application with a medical certificate must be submitted immediately on her return to the college.
- (ii) Leave should be applied on printed form to be obtained from the

college office or downloaded from the college website. It should be countersigned by the father / guardian of the student and submitted to the class teacher.

- (iii) Leave preceding or following long vacation or for days when special functions are held will be granted only by the Principal.
- (iv) A student who wishes to withdraw from the college or hostel rolls must do so formally in writing. A letter from father or guardian must accompany such an application. The student has to pay all the dues till the date her name is formally withdrawn.

LIBRARY RULES

- The library remains open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. except on Sundays and holidays.
- Students shall maintain proper decorum and silence inside the library and its vicinity.
- The students shall be required to show their identity card at the entry counter.
- Every member shall sign in the attendance register kept at the entry of the library.
- In case a library card is lost, the reader must report to the librarian immediately in writing to get a duplicate card issued.
- A maximum of four books will be issued to PG students and two books to UG students.
- Books shall be issued to the members on their library card for 14 days only.
- The fine of Rs. 1/- per day shall be charged from students for late return of book.
- No personal belongings like bags, purse, helmets, personal books etc. are allowed inside the library. The same shall be kept at the property counter near the library entrance at the students' own risk.
- No person shall damage the library books/ materials. Damaged books shall have to be replaced by making payment for the book value and an additional fine of Rs. 200/- per book.
- A member who violates rules shall be liable to forfeit this privilege of admission and borrowing of books from the library.
- Reserved and reference books will not be issued. Books once issued shall not be reissued.

Code of Conduct

KMV provides a code of conduct which every student entering its portals is expected to follow. Each student of the college is expected to look on herself as the custodian of the college. She is expected to conduct herself with decorum and dignity that is worthy of the Institution. The students are expected to observe the following rules :

- To listen carefully to the instructions given during assembly and follow them earnestly.
- It is the duty of every student to pay proper respect to the teachers, office staff and hostel staff.
- Special attention must be given to the instructions on the notice board.
- Cleanliness must be maintained at all costs. Bits of papers and skins of fruit should be put into dust bins kept for the purpose at various places.
- Roaming about in the corridors is not allowed.
- Before leaving the class-rooms, the students must ensure all the lights and fans are switched off.
- Students must talk softly and not shout from a distance.
- Day scholars are not allowed to enter the hostel.
- Students must behave properly in the bus. They can get down only at the stops from where they board the bus. A student will be allowed to get down on the way only if she shows permission letter from her parents/guardians to that effect.
- Students should utilize their free periods in the library and must not indulge in unnecessary loud talk or gossip.
- Students should be punctual and regular in attending their classes. They must bring their identity cards daily and must produce the same if asked by a teacher.
- Writing and sticking bills on the walls of the college, hostel and office buildings is strictly prohibited.
- Use of mobile phones by the students is strictly prohibited in the college.
- Ignorance of rules will not be accepted as an excuse for their non-observance.
- Lectures delivered and to appear in the house examinations to be eligible to sit in final examination.

- Students should come in simple dresses. Wearing of unbecoming, glamorous clothes and jewellery is strictly prohibited.
- Students can leave the college only after their classes are over or after the six period whichever is later. For no reason will they be allowed to leave the college before the specified time.
- It is compulsory for every student to wear white khadi uniform on Mondays.
- The college time-table once made is final. No appeal from students for any change in time-table will be entertained.
- A student found guilty of unfair means during an examination will be liable to deterrent punishment, which may even take the form of expulsion from the college or disqualification from the End Semester Examinations.

The College has a stringent security system in place. College Authorities will, in no way be responsible for any student (day scholar or boarder) who defies the discipline and dares the security personnel to move out of the campus.

RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN THE COLLEGE

Students known for indulging in ragging would not be given admission while those found ragging their juniors would be rusticated from the college with an F.I.R. being filed against them with the Police.
