Women Empowerment Cell

The women Empowerment cell was set up by the Gandhian Studies centre of the College in 2009 with the aim of equipping the rural girls with certain life skills. Who for some reason could not pursue their studies, these included Divorcees, Widows, Deserted NRI Brides, Training is provided in the centre in Basic Computers, Fashion Designing and Cosmetology. Till date nearly three thousand women have been trained by the centre. Fifty girls were trained by the centre in this Session.









Reaching Out to the Women in Villages...

Free Vocational camps are organised for women who Cannot come to the campus for training.

A One day Camp on Hair Care and Block printing was organised in Village Mubarkpur Sheikhe on 7 February 2020. Held in the Gurdwara more than Forty Women participated in the camp.





A Camp on hair styling and health awareness was organised in Village Bhatija on 22 March 2018 in which around thirty Women Participated.



One day Awareness Camp was organised in Village Reru, girls and Women were sensitized to get training and Stand up on their Feet.



One day Camp was organised in the Gurdwara in Village Mubarkpur Sheikhe. More than Thirty Women were trained in Basic Makeup and hair styling.

KMV contributed a truck load of relief material to Kerala relief fund


